Performance Instructions for

NIGHT THORN

Bb Clarinet:

1. For "Laughing":



Emulate the sound of laughter; pitch is less important than contour, timbre, and tone here.

2. Chaotic swooping/scooping/noodling



Perform this by scooping while simultaneously wiggling your fingers on the keys. Animalistic sounding, or like hysterical babbling.

Bass Clarinet:

1. Multiphonic fingerings are included above the staff.
2. Slap tongue



Aim for clear pitch and as sharp/percussive an attack as you can achieve.

3. Timbral trill/alternating fingerings



Bassoon:

1. Portamento - if necessary, these can be performed using lip glissando technique.
2. Multiphonics

Within the score, **bassoon multiphonics** are spelled out in approximation on the staff, with a corresponding label (G4, 1E5, or 1Bb) included. Please refer to the key below.


An attempt has been made for a possible tablature notation of each multiphonic. The large note on the staff designates the base fingering (to be read in bass clef) which is used as foundation

fingering for the multiphonic. The small, shaded note corresponds to the tone-hold or key that is to be added to the base fingering. The small empty note corresponds to the tone-hole or key that is to be removed from the base fingering.

Register and wing keys are noted by their key name above the staff, as are trill keys.
